Handel's greatest Oratorio

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The Hertfordshire Baroque Soloists

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Messiah is an English-language oratorio composed in 1741 by George Frideric Handel. It was first performed in Dublin on 13 April 1742 and received its London premiere a year later. After an initially modest public reception, the oratorio gained in popularity, eventually becoming one of the best-known and most frequently performed choral works in Western music.

Although the structure of **Messiah** resembles that of opera, it is not in dramatic form; there are no impersonations of characters and no direct speech. The work's first part deals with the birth of Jesus, the second covers the death of Jesus, and the third his resurrection.

Even though the heating had failed, we gave a wonderful performance of Handel's Messiah in St Nicholas Church, Harpenden, to a very good sized audience on 12 April 2025. All four soloists were outstanding, and the Hertfordshire Baroque Soloists, led by Dianne Terry, played brilliantly, as did Martyn Noble, Organ Continuo. The fabulous soloists and orchestra inspired Hardynge Choir to give a superb performance.

The audience clearly enjoyed the performance, as complimentary comments we received included, "Brilliant" and "I enjoyed it more than Gareth Malone's Messiah".
